



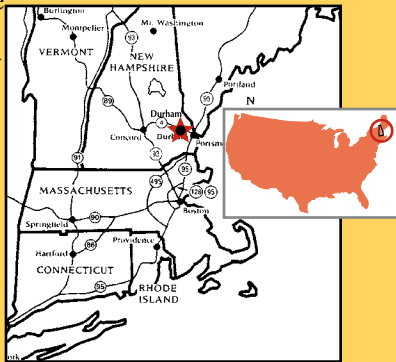
## About the University of New Hampshire

The University of New Hampshire, founded in 1866, is known for its academic quality and excellence in research. It serves more than 10,000 degree students each year, who major in a variety of fields in the arts and sciences.

The University is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc. Accreditation by the association indicates that the institution has been carefully evaluated and found to meet standards agreed upon by qualified educators.

## The Location

The University is in a very safe and beautiful location. It is located on the Atlantic seacoast on a 200-acre campus in a rural area – with easy access to Boston, just 1.5 hours away. Portland, Maine is 1.5 hours to our north. New York City and Montreal are also close by – just a 6- or 7-hour drive. New Hampshire is a popular area for tourists year-round, who enjoy our beaches, lakes, mountains, parks, and historical sites of interest.



## Transportation

Students who are arriving by air should fly to Boston, Massachusetts (Logan International Airport), or to Manchester, New Hampshire (Manchester Boston Regional Airport). We can provide you with transportation information to/from either airport and UNH.

## About the ESL Institute

English courses are offered at the elementary level, the intermediate level and the advanced level. Students at these levels receive intensive English instruction for four hours per day, five days per week, in the areas of reading, writing, listening and speaking as well as pronunciation and contextualized grammar instruction. For students who have a TOEFL score of 60 or above (Internet-based) or 500 or above (paper-based, administered by the ESL Institute), the ESL Institute provides “bridge” courses where students can simultaneously enroll in one to two University of New Hampshire academic classes while continuing to intensively study English from four to ten hours per week. At these “bridge” levels, students have the opportunity to “try out” academic courses in a supportive environment.

## Class Size and Make Up

All ESL instruction is provided in small, personal classrooms, averaging a class size of approximately 12 to 15. Students come from all around the world: Asia, the Middle East, Africa, Europe, and the Americas.

## Flexible Enrollment

At the ESL Institute, we provide flexible enrollment times for students: Students have the option of registering for 8 or 16 weeks during the academic school year or for 5 or 10 weeks during the summer sessions.

## Admission to the University of New Hampshire

For those interested in full admission to a University of New Hampshire degree program, a TOEFL score of 80 or above (Internet-based) or 550 or above (paper-based, administered by the ESL Institute) is required. Also, for those students who do successfully gain admittance to the University of New Hampshire, up to 16 credit hours from their work in the ESL Institute can be applied as University of New Hampshire credit. The faculty and staff at the ESL Institute will work individually with students seeking full admission to UNH, helping to ensure that their admission packet is completed in a timely manner for UNH admission review.

## About Visas

International students who come to UNH must have a student visa. After we receive your registration and payment, UNH's Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS) will issue your immigration documents and tell you how to apply for a visa. The Department of Homeland Security charges a fee of \$200, called 'the SEVIS fee.' We will pay this fee for you and send you the receipt along with your other immigration documents. Please take these documents with you when you go to the U.S. Consulate to apply for your visa.
